

Early Issue "Microcosm" in a Contemporary Binding

ACKERMANN, R[udolph]. [*The Microcosm of London; or, London in Miniature*]. London: R. Ackermann's Repository of Arts, 1808-1810. First edition, early issue, with text watermarked 1806-1807 and plates watermarked 1805-1808. Three large quarto volumes. Woodcut title and engraved dedication leaf in each volume. With 104 hand-colored aquatint plates. Early nineteenth-century half green morocco gilt over marbled boards. An excellent copy, with prepublication watermarks and seven of Abbey's twelve "key" plates.

Forty-three hand-colored etched plates (including added pictorial title). With the original tissue guards. All plates dated 1822. Each plate contains two to six comical scenes, including several hunting or sporting scenes, illustrating titles of popular songs. Handsomely bound by Riviére & Son in late nineteenth-century olive green morocco over green cloth boards. A superb copy.

"This... is of a very different sort from Stothard's *Seven Ages...* It represents a satirical treatment of that speech, with hand-coloured aquatints by Henry Alken which are very amusing" (Colin Franklin).







Not in Sadleir or Wolff.

The first appearance of many of Andersen's most beloved stories, including *The Red Shoes, The Nightingale, The Little Match Girl*, etc. A work of extreme scarcity. 



As it is quite unusual for the wrappers to be present, a small missing piece is not a significant issue. An excellent copy of this exceptionally rare suite of plates. 





An extremely scarce series of thirty-six mounted hand-colored lithographed plates, heightened with gum arabic, depicting Ladies and Lords of the French Court. Modern quarter morocco over original boards. Each work contains a Falconry plate. A truly spectacular series of plates. Belliard (1798-1843) "was active between 1820 and 1830. He was one of the fine early masters in the field of contemporary portraits of distinguished Europeans".







Large quarto. Folding engraved plan and three engraved charts, two folding and printed on pale blue paper. Original blue boards, neatly re-backed at an early date. A spectacular and very large copy. Housed in a quarter brown morocco clamshell case. The most famous voyage in recent history.

First Irish Edition

BOSWELL, James. *The Life of Samuel Johnson, LL.D.* Dublin: Printed by John Chambers, for R. Cross, 1792. First Irish edition, closely following the 1791 London first edition and preceding the 1792 London second edition. Three octavo volumes. Bound without the folding "Round Robin" facsimile and the folding plate of facsimiles of Johnson's handwriting. Contemporary tree calf. Expertly re-backed with smooth spines richly gilt. A very attractive set. Boswell: "Mr. Johnson, I do indeed come from Scotland, but I cannot help it". Johnson: "That, Sir, I find, is what a very great many of your countrymen cannot help".



Musical Satire in Rare Suite of Hand-Colored Lithographs

BOUCHOT, Frédéric, [illustrator]. Les Bonnes Têtes Musicales. Paris: Chez Aubert & Cie., [ca. 1830]. Folio. Twenty-two (of thirty) hand-colored lithographed plates heightened with gum arabic. Loose in cloth clamshell case. Minimal browning, not affecting images; foxing to plate no. 1. Very scarce; only one copy in OCLC, at Harvard (with only 23 plates; no complete copies). Not in Hiler or Lipperheide. Bouchot's delightful suite of caricatures gently punctures the pretensions of the contemporary music world. Bouchot collaborated on individually published albums with such artists as Daumier and Morin.



Anne Brontë's Excessively Rare Second and Final Novel

Volume I with the excessively rare half-title, but bound without the final advertisement leaf. Bound ca. 1900 by Rivière & Son in full tan polished calf gilt. An exceptional copy of this notoriously rare title. Number 1 in Sadleir's list of "Comparative Scarcities." Considered to be one of the first feminist novels, wherein, Helen, the main character slams the bedroom in her husbands face after suffering continuing abuse, thereby overturning the sexual politics of the time.



Considered by Many to be Unsuitable for Young Ladies

[BRONTE, Charolotte]. *Jane Eyre.* An Autobiography. Edited by Currer Bell. In Three Volumes. London: Smith, Elder, and Co., 1847. First Edition. Three octavo volumes. Complete with all three half-titles, but as usual, bound without the advertisements at the end of Volume I. Late nineteenth-century quarter calf over marbled boards, spines lettered and ruled in gilt. Minimal foxing or staining to a few leaves. An excellent copy in a nice early binding. "Despite it's strict adherence to conventional moral standards, it was considered by many to be unsuitable for young ladies..." (Oxford Companion to English Literature).

Lacking spine, facsimile back wrapper, supplied. Front wrapper has a few short tears. A little bit of foxing, but still an excellent copy. Although published simultaneously with the first American edition in cloth, this edition in wrappers edition is scarcer. A masterly portrayal of Belgian daily life with a highly personal use of the gothic. The opium scene within is amongst the first such to appear in a novel by a woman.

Charlotte contributed nineteen poems, Emily and Anne twenty-one each. "Dare not indulge in memory's rapturous pain."

Attention toreador: Don't spit on the floor, use the cuspidor; what do you think it's for?

Cloth clamshell case. A wonderfully clean and elegantly bound copy.

OCLC locates only two copies of this edition (at the New York Public Library and at Amherst College). Regarded as one of the most significant works of English literature.

A Stunning Archive of the Great Artist and Designer

BURNE-JONES, Sir Edward. Correspondence with Violet Maxse. London: [n. d., 1892-1897]. A collection of fifty-three Autograph Letters Signed to Violet Maxse, later Viscountess Milner, containing fifty original drawings in pencil, pen-and-ink, and wash. All mounted in the original two albums. A truly remarkable and historically important archive, unique and fine, including 15 drawings of his "fat ladies". A similar, but larger archive containing 300 letters with 140 drawings, all addressed to Violet's sister Olive Maxse, were sold at Sotheby's, London in 1989 for over \$265,000.

Original boards, uncut, a few leaves unopened, rebacked, chipped and soiled, upper joint starting, spine vellum with three inch crack, A few leaves carelessly opened, bookplate and name in ink, small ink presentation inscription on head of title. Withal, an extraordinary copy of a book rarely found in its original state. Chemised in a green cloth clamshell case.




